### **Celebration of Communion**

As we gather at this table,  
we remember that Jesus was born of Mary;  
he lived our common life on earth;  
he suffered and died for us;  
on the third day God raised him from the dead;  
and he is always present with us through the Holy Spirit.  
In his presence, and in the company of all the people of God, past, present,  
and to come,  
we celebrate the Supper of the Lord.

We hear the narrative of the Institution of the Lord's Supper as it is recorded  
by St Paul in I Corinthians Chapter 11

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body which is broken for you. Do this in remembrance of me'. In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me'. For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

and to make us one in him.  
For all these gifts we thank you,  
and we join with all your people on earth and in heaven,  
in joyful praise:

Hosanna! **Hosanna!**

**We praise you that we are here today,  
around the table of Jesus.  
We have heard the good news of your love;  
the cross is the sign of your arms stretched out in love for us  
and the empty tomb declares your love stronger than death.**

**Christ has died! Christ has died!  
Christ is risen! Christ is risen!  
Christ will come again! Christ will come again!**

**Send your Holy Spirit upon this bread and wine,  
and upon your people,  
that Christ may be with us,  
and we may be made ready to live for you  
and to do what you ask of us,  
today, and every day to come.  
We make this prayer through Jesus Christ,  
in the power of the Holy Spirit,  
in the love of the Creator, one God,  
to whom be glory and praise forever,  
Amen.**

**Eat this bread. It is the bread of life.  
Drink this wine. It is the cup of blessing.**
