We pray particularly for a change of heart for all who are destroying in Israel, Gaza, Lebanon and neighbouring countries, in Russia and Ukraine, in Somalia, Sudan and other African countries, and wherever your kingdom of justice and peace is denied. We ask for relief for all victims of war. We pray for all who are hungry, homeless, unemployed or ill, so that they cannot earn their own bread. Help us to share your harvest as brothers and sisters.

We pray for all those who are sick or suffering, especially people whom we know or know about. Send them your harvest of healing and comfort.
